

## IN A NUTSHELL : WHAT'S NEW WITH THE CLEAN INDUSTRIAL DEAL ?



Since 2019, the European Green Deal strategy has been put into place by the European Commission to engage industry into green sustainability.

The aim is climate neutrality by 2050. Since then, on 26th February 2025, a new Clean Industrial Deal has been pushed. The 3 following topics have been underlined :

- Climate neutrality by 2050
- Become a global leader in Circular Economy by 2030 by boosting demand for "clean products"
- Support EU Competitiveness by supporting the clean transition with a budget of over €100 billion Euros. The idea is also to support companies to get easier access to capital public investment tools

If we focus only on circularity as a Priority, main targets are to :

- Reduce waste and extend the life of materials by promoting eco-circular solutions, including remanufacturing
- Create an EU Critical Raw Material Centre
- Adopt a "Circular Economy Act" to accelerate the environmental transition. EU aims to have 24% of materials circular by 2030.

With the Clean Industrial Deal, the path to circular economy continues to be strengthen. We can esperate that the regulation will evolute in favour of remanufacturing and hope that the use of Repair parts from circular economy shouldn't be an option is the future.
